Hi Annette,

It's not often that I have the opportunity to sit down and write to you and in doing so, I want to firstly apologize for the delay, but more importantly I want to thank you for having been such a strong supporter of our project since our arrival at the beginning of this year.

I have attached a draft for your perusal, and I took the liberty of concentrating the focus on K'omoks' specific concerns, with less focus on our activity which most people will have difficulty interpreting unless they come here and see what we are doing.

I might suggest that the K'omoks band may have more easily understood the important work we are doing if they were a little more engaged by way of a site visit before voicing their objection.

Contrary to what I have just mentioned above, you on the other hand made the effort to drive all the way here on your own time (it was a weekend) from Port Alberni, with an open mind and with a view to understanding what exactly it is that we are doing.

I hope my tone is not too brash or offensive, but I think we have been sufficiently patient and I now find myself in a situation where companies such as Seaspan are requiring proper environmental compliance and due diligence such as hazmat reports for all of their vessels that we are hauling, and as they are becoming more dependent on our services we are concerned that this issue could become a real problem. To the best of my knowledge, we are the only company with such a facility whose operation is solely dedicated to the dismantling and recycling of vessels and barges.

When you have a moment, let me know what your thoughts are.
